



SMOOCH SPRAY TIPS:

- * Before Each use – shake vigorously until all particles are mixed. (Sprayer can get clogged if particles are sucked into the nozzle).
- * Spray in the direction of the arrow.
- * Hold as upright as possible when spraying (I like to stand my card against the back of the color catcher and spray towards the card).
 - * TIP – lay scrap cardstock flat in color catcher to catch mist that falls and use this cardstock scrap in additional cards and scrapbooking projects
- * Spritz is “wet” allow card to dry before adding 2nd color of spray or completing project.
- * If ink dries outside the nozzle, remove the nozzle and submerge in household cleaner such as Windex or Formula 409. Rinse, replace the nozzle, shake well and spray.
- * For Fine “mist” Spray 8-10 inches from Project
- * For Heavier “mist” spray closer to object
- * I personally have found that firm “squirts” or pressure fully pressing the nozzle the whole way down in consistent “squirts” gives a better coverage, helps eliminate clogging and the “blobs”
- * Smooth Spritz bottles are made of glass, I store mine upright in a small tin to prevent them from rolling and possible breaking and to help keep nozzle clear.
- * Use the **color catcher** (item #121093) to protect your work area from over spray.
- * As with any new product experiment on scrap paper until comfortable with using
- * Be sure to test out the spritz on a sample of what you will be using. I have used it several times and depending on the surface the colors can be a little different.

TECHNIQUES – USES:

Add shimmer to cardstock, chipboard, other craft projects
Spray over stencils to create a shimmery stenciled background/look
Layer look by spraying small amounts of two colors starting with lighter first
Build color by spraying several thin coats allowing to dry between coats
