

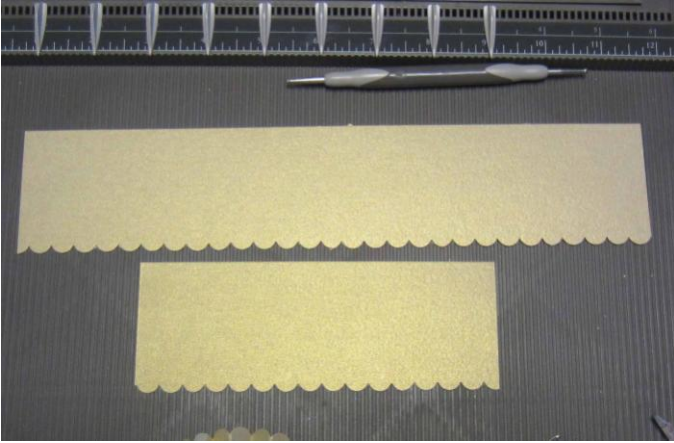
Rosette Basics

These measurements are for a finished rosette approx. 4 ½ inches.

1. Cut 2 lengths of cardstock – 2 ¼ x 11 and 2 ¼ x 6 “
2. Scallop Edges of Both pieces of Cardstock

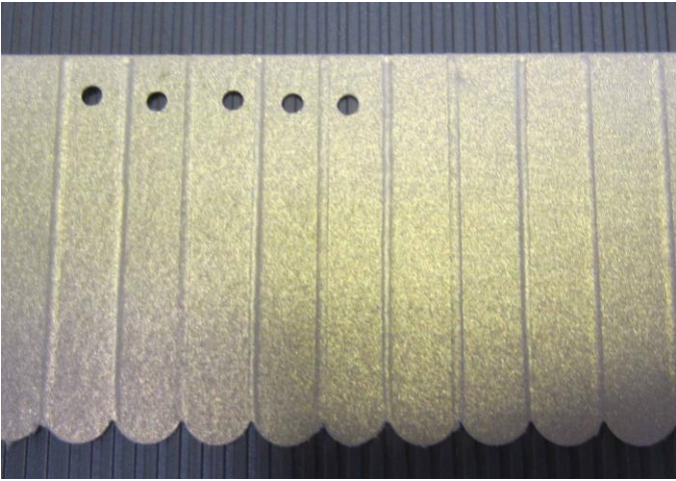


3. Score every ¼ inch – tip to make the cardstock fan fold easier – one side 1 score every ½ inch, flip cardstock over and score in between these scores.

*It will be approximate as you are really scoring in the dips between the scallops and you may need to nudge the cardstock to score in these dips.

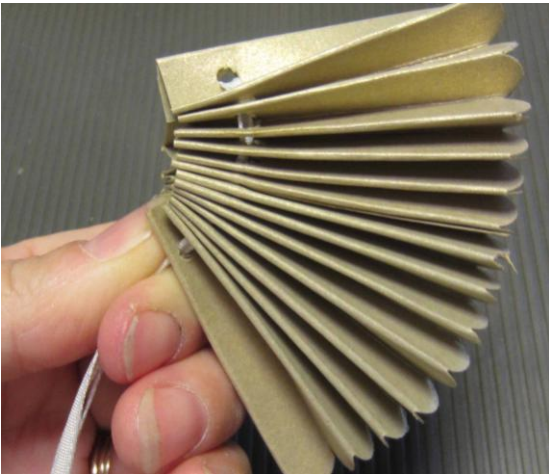


Step 4 – using small punch on Crop a Dile –punch a hole in each ¼” section

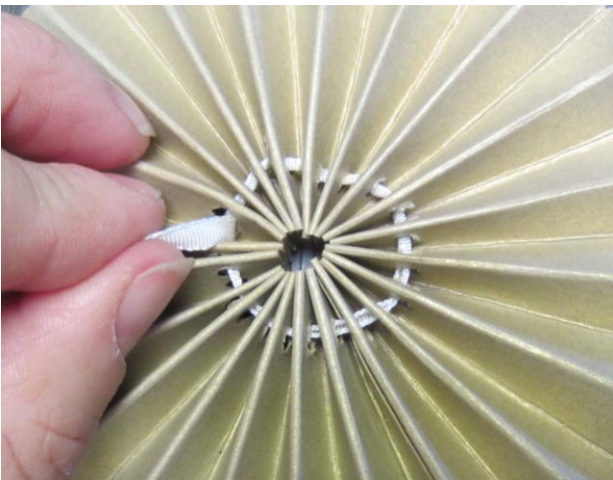


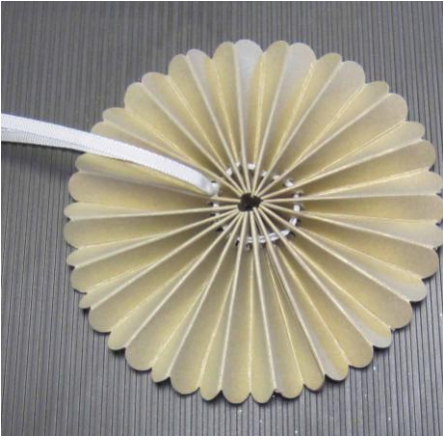
*Tip fan fold paper several times and press creases with score tool. The better your score marks the easier the rosette will come together

Step 5 – thread bakers twine, hemp, linen thread, $\frac{1}{4}$ grosgrain into large craft/embroidery needle – feed thread through holes and grasp both ends and pull to bring the folds together.



Step 6 – Push on center of rosette and flatten on table – tie the string into a knot to secure your rosette. You can know us the extra length of string to tie a button on or as a loop to hang as an ornament





Finish Rosette off by adhering large cardstock circle to front and back, then adding desired embellishments. I have found that hot glue works best .
